Rules for entry and return to the Czech Republic

The information may regularly change and it is necessary to check the current situation right before travelling to the Czech Republic.

The conditions differ according to the personal situation of the person:

<u>Part A</u>: Concerns Czech citizens, foreigners with Czech residence permit, Citizens of EU+ and foreigners with residence permit issued by EU+.

<u>Part B</u>: Concerns non EU citizens without residence permit issued by the Czech Republic or by EU+ country, non EU citizens who have a short-term visa issued before 11th May 2020 or short-term or long-term visa issued by another EU+ country. https://www.mvcr.cz/mvcren/imgDetail.aspx?docid=22328394

- → The rules apply for all persons who have stayed abroad outside Czech Republic for more than 12 hours and are now entering Czech territory.
- → Foreigners of part B can enter to the Czech Republic only for specific reasons, including **study purposes**. It is recommended to have a proof of studies with you (student card, confirmation of studies).
