SCHOLARSHIP REGULATIONS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH BOHEMIA IN ČESKÉ BUDĚJOVICE (1st consolidated version)

Article 1 Introductory provisions

- (1) These Scholarship Regulations of the University of South Bohemia in České Budějovice (hereinafter referred to as the 'Scholarship Regulations') govern the procedure and conditions for awarding scholarships at the University of South Bohemia in České Budějovice (hereinafter referred to as 'USB') in accordance with Section 91 et seq. of Act No. 111/1998, on Higher Education Institutions and on Amendments and Supplements to Other Acts (the Higher Education Act), as amended (hereinafter referred to as the 'Act'). Further details on scholarships shall be determined by ordinances of the Rector or Dean; such ordinances must be in accordance with these Scholarship Regulations.
- (2) Scholarships may be paid:
 - a) from the USB Scholarship Fund established pursuant to Section 18(6)(c) of the Act, which is divided into parts administered by the faculties in terms of generation and use;
 - b) from other USB's own resources;
 - c) from state budget funds provided to USB in the form of a subsidy or contribution in accordance with the Act;
 - d) from funds concentrated in the National Fund or from other public funds provided to USB under other legislation or within the framework of the implementation of an international treaty to which the Czech Republic is bound.
- (3) In addition to scholarships under these scholarship rules, a USB student or other person may be awarded a scholarship by the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports under announced programmes pursuant to Section 91b(2) of the Act.

Article 2

General rules for awarding scholarships

- (1) The following scholarships may be awarded under these scholarship regulations:
 - a) merit scholarship pursuant to Section 91(2)(a) of the Act;
 - b) premium scholarship for outstanding research, development and innovation, artistic or other creative achievements pursuant to Section 91(2)(b) of the Act;
 - c) scholarship to support research, development and innovation activities pursuant to Section 91(2)(c) of the Act;
 - d) social scholarship pursuant to Section 91(2)(d) of the Act;
 - e) extraordinary scholarship pursuant to Section 91(2)(e) of the Act;
 - f) scholarship for students with specific needs for the purpose of equalising learning opportunities pursuant to Section 91(2)(e) of the Act;
 - g) scholarship to support the development of industry cooperation pursuant to Section 91(2)(b) and (e) of the Act;
 - h) accommodation scholarship pursuant to Section 91(2)(e) of the Act;
 - i) scholarship to support studies, creative activities, educational activities or practical internships carried out within the framework of mobilities pursuant to Section 91(2)(f) of the Act;
 - j) doctoral scholarship pursuant to Section 91a of the Act.
- (2) Scholarships under these scholarship regulations may be awarded to USB students. Scholarships pursuant to paragraph 1(a), (b) and (i) of the scholarship regulations may also be awarded to other persons listed in Section 91(3), second and third sentences, of the Act and below in these scholarship regulations, provided that they are not financed from the sources listed in Section 91(3) of the Act.
- (3) There is no legal entitlement to the award of a scholarship in a specific amount, with the exception of scholarships under Articles 7 and 9. In making the decision, the dean shall also take into account the fulfilment of the student's obligations under Section 63 of the Act.
- (4) Scholarships may only be awarded for such a period and in such a total amount that their payment is guaranteed by the amount and prescribed structure of available funds.
- (5) Scholarships are awarded for a maximum period of one academic or calendar year, or as one-off scholarships.
- (6) The award of one scholarship does not preclude the possibility of awarding other scholarships referred to in paragraph 1.

Article 3

Decisions on scholarships

- (1) The following persons are authorised to decide on scholarships according to the source of funding for the scholarship:

- a) the dean of the faculty in the case of scholarships paid from the relevant part of the scholarship fund pursuant to Article 1(2)(a) or from other sources pursuant to Article 1(2)(b) to (d) administered by his or her faculty;
 - b) the Rector or the vice-rector, on his behalf, in the case of decisions on scholarships paid from sources pursuant to Article 1(2)(b) to (d), if this source is not administered by any of the faculties of USB and the Rector or the vice-rector is the guarantor of the relevant project or part thereof, or in the case of scholarship funding from multiple sources, including a source that is not administered by any of the USB faculties, or including sources administered by multiple faculties.
- (2) The award of a scholarship is subject to administrative proceedings governed by Section 68 et seq. of the Act and the relevant provisions of Act No. 500/2004, the Administrative Procedure Code, as amended. The scholarship is awarded by a decision delivered in accordance with Article 30 of the Statutes of the University of South Bohemia in České Budějovice (hereinafter referred to as the 'Statutes').
 - (3) If it follows from the relevant directly applicable regulations of the European Union or from international treaties to which the Czech Republic is bound, and from acts issued on their basis, USB provides the scholarship on the basis of a contract concluded with the scholarship recipient and no administrative proceedings for the award of the scholarship are conducted.
 - (4) In the case of decisions on the award of scholarships to other persons referred to in Section 91(3), second and third sentences, of the Act, the provisions of Section 68(2) to (4) of the Act on the participation, status and rights and obligations of students and the procedure of higher education institutions in proceedings concerning scholarships and the course of such proceedings, Section 69a(3) of the Act on delivery to students and Section 69b of the Act on student submissions to higher education institutions shall apply analogously.

Article 4

Merit scholarship

- (1) A merit scholarship pursuant to Section 91(2)(a) of the Act may be awarded to students of bachelor's and master's degree programmes in full-time studies who in the previous academic year fulfilled the conditions for subjects totalling at least 60 credits and achieved a weighted grade point average of no more than 1.60 in the given academic year. A merit scholarship may also be awarded to graduates of full-time bachelor's and master's degree programmes who fulfilled the condition set out in the previous sentence during their studies.
- (2) A merit scholarship may only be awarded if the student or graduate has fulfilled the condition under paragraph 1 during the standard period of studies. A student who, during their studies at USB, completed a study stay at a foreign higher education institution as part of an international study mobility programme and passed all the courses enrolled in at the foreign higher education institution may be awarded a merit scholarship for the standard period of studies extended by up to one year.

- (3) The amount of the merit scholarship and the details of its award are determined by the dean by means of an ordinance.
- (4) The merit scholarship is awarded by decision of the dean ex officio on the basis of a proposal prepared by the staff of the faculty's student affairs office or another faculty employee authorised by the dean.

Article 5

Premium scholarship

- (1) A premium scholarship for outstanding research, development and innovation, artistic or other creative achievements pursuant to Section 91(2)(b) of the Act may be awarded to students who have achieved outstanding results in the field of research, development, innovation or artistic or other outstanding creative achievements related to their studies. A premium scholarship may also be awarded to graduates of USB who fulfilled the condition under the previous sentence during their studies.
- (2) The premium scholarship is awarded by decision of the competent authority (Article 3(1)) ex officio on the basis of a proposal by any USB employee.
- (3) The premium scholarship is awarded together with public awards:
 - a) the 'Rector's Award' for outstanding results to students of the master's degree programme who have defended their thesis with an 'excellent' grade and at the same time obtained an overall study evaluation of 'graduated with honours' and achieved a weighted study average of no more than 1.20 for the entire period of studies;
 - b) 'Dean's Award' according to the rules set by the dean;
 - c) other awards according to the decision of the dean or according to the rules set by the dean's ordinance.
- (4) Information on the award of a bonus scholarship, including a brief justification, without specifying the amount of the scholarship awarded, shall be announced orally during the graduation ceremony or in writing in the public section of the website of the relevant faculty.

Article 6

Scholarship to support research, development and innovation activities of students

- (1) A scholarship to support research, development and innovation activities of students pursuant to Section 91(2)(c) of the Act may be awarded to students who are actively involved in projects of the USB Grant Agency, grant agencies of USB constituent parts or other activities in the field of research, development and innovation carried out at USB.

- (2) Scholarships to support research, development and innovation activities of students are awarded by decision of the dean ex officio on the basis of a proposal by a USB employee responsible for managing the research, development and innovation activities in which the student is involved.

Article 7

Social scholarship

- (1) A social scholarship pursuant to Section 91(2)(d) of the Act is awarded by decision of the dean on the basis of a duly justified application by the student. The student must provide evidence of the reasons for the application. In cases worthy of special consideration, the dean may accept a sworn statement by the student regarding these reasons as evidence of the reasons for the application.
- (2) A social scholarship pursuant to Section 91(5) of the Act shall always be awarded to students who are entitled to state social assistance benefits, which include a child bonus, pursuant to the Act on State Social Assistance Benefits, if the decisive income of household members determined for the purposes of state social assistance benefits does not exceed the product of the family's minimum subsistence level and a coefficient of 1.5.
- (3) A social scholarship pursuant to Section 91(5) of the Act is awarded by decision of the dean on the basis of a student's application. Entitlement to this scholarship is proven by the student by means of a written confirmation issued at his or her request by the state social assistance authority that granted the state social assistance benefit, stating that the income of the household members assessed for the purposes of the state social assistance benefit in the relevant period, which includes the month of September, did not exceed the product of the minimum subsistence amount for household members and a coefficient of 1.5. The confirmation for the purposes of granting the scholarship is valid for 11 months from the end of September within the relevant period for which the income of household members was determined. Students may only apply for the scholarship once for a given period, i.e. at only one higher education institution, regardless of how many degree programmes they are enrolled in at USB or other higher education institutions at the same time. The application, accompanied by written confirmation from the state social assistance authority and a sworn statement that the student has not applied for a social scholarship for the same period or part thereof at another higher education institution, or that the student has not been awarded a social scholarship for the same period or part thereof, shall be submitted by the student in electronic form via the USB information system (Article 29 of the Statutes) in electronic form after enrolment in the programme or as soon as the entitlement to the scholarship arises, if the entitlement arises in the course of studies.
- (4) A social scholarship pursuant to Section 91(5) of the Act is granted for the standard period of studies for ten months in the academic year. No social scholarship is awarded for the months of July and August. If a student meets the conditions for

entitlement to this scholarship only for a part of the calendar month, they shall be awarded this scholarship in the amount to which they are entitled for the entire calendar month. The scholarship is paid in three instalments, namely for the periods January to March, April to June, and September to December. The monthly amount of the scholarship corresponds to one quarter of the monthly minimum wage, with the amount of the scholarship thus determined being rounded up to the nearest ten crowns.

- (5) A social scholarship under Section 91(5) of the Act cannot be granted retroactively. This does not apply to the period from the date of submission of the application to the date of entry into force of the decision granting the social scholarship under Section 91(5) of the Act.

Article 8

Extraordinary scholarship

- (1) An extraordinary scholarship pursuant to Section 91(2)(e) of the Act may be granted to students in cases worthy of special consideration.
- (2) Cases worthy of special consideration include, among other things, extraordinary activities to help students with special needs.
- (3) An extraordinary scholarship is awarded by decision of the dean, Rector or the vice-rector, on his behalf, ex officio, on the basis of a proposal by any USB employee or on the basis of a duly justified request by a student.

Article 9

Scholarship for students with special needs

- (1) A scholarship for students with special needs for the purpose of equalising learning opportunities pursuant to Section 91(2)(e) of the Act may be awarded to students with disabilities, chronic illnesses or other health problems or disadvantages.
- (2) Scholarships for students with specific needs are awarded by decision of the Rector or the vice-rector, on his behalf, ex officio, on the basis of a proposal prepared by the head of the organisational unit of USB whose competence includes support for students with special needs, on the basis of documents submitted by the student proving his or her health condition and on the basis of an objective need to compensate for increased costs related to studies.

Article 10

Scholarship to support the development of industry cooperation

- (1) A scholarship to support the development of industry cooperation pursuant to Section 91(2)(b) and (e) of the Act may be awarded to students involved in activities developing cooperation between USB, or faculty, and the sphere of application relevant to the given area of education within the meaning of Government Regulation No. 274/2016, on Standards for Accreditation in Higher Education (hereinafter referred to as the 'Regulation on Standards').
- (2) The scholarship to support the development of industry cooperation is awarded by decision of the dean ex officio on the basis of a proposal by a USB employee responsible for managing activities to develop cooperation with practice within the meaning of the Regulation on Standards.

Article 11 **Accommodation scholarship**

- (1) An accommodation scholarship pursuant to Section 91(2)(e) of the Act may be awarded to students of bachelor's, master's or doctoral degree programmes who are studying full-time, provided that they have not yet obtained a higher education diploma in the degree programme of the given type, have not exceeded the standard period of studies, even in any of the concurrent degree programmes in which they may be enrolled, and do not have permanent residence in the district in which they are studying.
- (2) For the purposes of assessing whether a student meets the conditions under paragraph 1, the period of studies shall also include the periods of all previous studies in bachelor's, master's and doctoral degree programmes that were completed other than in accordance with Section 45(3) or Section 46(3) of the Act, unless it concerns previous studies after which the student duly completed a degree programme of the same type. The period during which the student studied in such degree programmes, or in such degree programmes and in the current degree programme concurrently, shall be counted only once in the period of studies. However, the recognised period of parenthood within the meaning of Section 21(1)(f) of the Act shall be deducted from the total period of studies calculated in accordance with this paragraph.
- (3) A master's degree programme that is not consecutive to a bachelor's degree programme, and a bachelor's degree programme are considered to be degree programmes of the same type for the purposes of paragraphs 1 and 2.
- (4) An accommodation scholarship may be awarded to students who meet the conditions set out in paragraph 1, even for the period of studies at a foreign higher education institution carried out during their studies at USB as part of an international study mobility programme.

- (5) Foreign students who are students of USB within the framework of the international study mobility programme and students who have been awarded a scholarship by the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports pursuant to Section 91b of the Act for the purpose of supporting accommodation or studies in the Czech Republic are not eligible for an accommodation scholarship.
- (6) Fulfilment of the conditions for the award of an accommodation scholarship under paragraph 1 is verified on the basis of data kept in the Combined Student Register Information Database (hereinafter referred to as 'SIMS').
- (7) The accommodation scholarship is awarded for a scholarship period that is usually the same as the calendar year. If a student submits an application for an accommodation scholarship during a given calendar year, the scholarship period begins in the month in which the application was submitted. Students who meet the conditions for the award of an accommodation scholarship under paragraphs 1 to 4 may be awarded an accommodation scholarship only for the part of the scholarship period during which they meet these conditions, in a proportionate amount according to the number of months during which they meet these conditions, with a month in which the student met these conditions for 15 or more days also being considered a full month.
- (8) The amount of the accommodation scholarship is determined by the Rector. The accommodation scholarship is paid in quarterly instalments, the dates of which are determined by the Rector, always after the expiry of the period decisive for fulfilling the conditions for the award of the accommodation scholarship for the last month of the payment quarter, i.e. at the earliest after the 15th day of the relevant month.
- (9) The accommodation scholarship for the first scholarship period pursuant to paragraph 7 shall be awarded by decision of the dean based on the student's application. If the student also meets the conditions for the award of an accommodation scholarship pursuant to paragraphs 1 to 4 in subsequent scholarship periods, the accommodation scholarship shall be awarded for these subsequent scholarship periods by decision of the dean ex officio.

Article 12

Scholarship to support studies, creative activities, educational activities or practical internships carried out within the framework of mobilities

- (1) A scholarship to support study, creative activities, educational activities or practical internships carried out within the framework of mobilities pursuant to Section 91(2)(f) of the Act may be awarded to students who participate in studies, creative activities, educational activities or practical internships carried out abroad or at USB within the framework of European Union programmes or other multilateral or bilateral international programmes or projects, and who have not exceeded the standard period of study extended by one year.
- (2) A scholarship to support studies, creative activities, educational activities or practical internships carried out within the framework of mobility may also be

awarded to graduates of a degree programme, participants in lifelong learning, academic staff and other employees of USB, provided that this scholarship is not financed:

- a) from the USB scholarship fund;
- b) from state budget funds provided to USB in the form of a contribution, unless it is support for activities carried out within the framework of the implementation of an international treaty to which the Czech Republic is bound, or an act issued on its basis, within the framework of the implementation of a European Union programme or other international programme or project, or within the framework of cooperation between a higher education institution and a foreign institution.

- (3) A scholarship to support studies, creative activities, educational activities or practical internships carried out within the framework of mobilities is awarded by decision of the dean or the Rector or the vice-rector, on their behalf, ex officio on the basis of a proposal from the faculty coordinator of international study mobility programmes or on the basis of a duly justified request from the student.
- (4) In cases and under conditions pursuant to Article 3(4) of these scholarship rules, the scholarship is awarded on the basis of a contract concluded with the scholarship recipient and no administrative proceedings are conducted for the award of the scholarship.

Article 13

Doctoral scholarship

- (1) Doctoral students enrolled in a doctoral degree programme after 1 September 2025 inclusive, or enrolled in a degree programme before that date, provided that their first period of studies in that degree programme began after 1 September 2025 inclusive, who are studying full-time, have not exceeded the standard period of studies, and are studying for the first time in a doctoral degree programme implemented by a public or state higher education institution or its faculty, shall be awarded a doctoral scholarship in accordance with paragraph 4 (hereinafter also referred to as a 'guaranteed doctoral scholarship').
- (2) Doctoral students enrolled in a doctoral degree programme before 1 September 2025, whose first period of studies in that degree programme began before 1 September 2025, who are studying full-time and have not exceeded the standard period of studies, shall be awarded a doctoral scholarship in accordance with paragraph 8 (hereinafter also referred to as the 'basic doctoral scholarship') The dean may, by his or her ordinance pursuant to paragraph 8, determine that the basic doctoral scholarship shall also be awarded to students who have exceeded the standard period of studies by one year; he or she is also entitled to set a lower basic scholarship amount for such students than that set for students who have not

exceeded the standard period of studies. All periods of previous unsuccessful studies in doctoral degree programmes shall be included in the period of studies referred to in the preceding sentences.

- (3) Doctoral students enrolled in a doctoral degree programme after 1 September 2025 inclusive, or enrolled before that date if their first period of studies in that degree programme began after 1 September 2025 inclusive, who are studying full-time, have not exceeded the standard period of study, and are not studying for the first time in a doctoral degree programme implemented by a public or state higher education institution or its faculty, may be awarded a basic doctoral scholarship, if so determined by the dean in accordance with paragraph 8. The dean is authorised to set further conditions for the award of a basic doctoral scholarship under this paragraph, as well as a different amount from the basic doctoral scholarship under paragraph 2.
- (4) The amount of the guaranteed doctoral scholarship is determined as follows:
 - a) if the student's doctoral income within the meaning of Section 91a(1) of the Act consists solely of a doctoral scholarship, the doctoral scholarship shall be awarded in the amount of the minimum monthly wage multiplied by a coefficient of 1.2 and then rounded up to the nearest ten crowns;
 - b) if the doctoral student's income within the meaning of Section 91a(1) of the Act consists of a combination of the monthly wage agreed for work in which the student, as an employee of USB or a cooperating employer, performs creative activities related to the creation of their dissertation, and a doctoral scholarship, the doctoral scholarship is awarded so that the sum of two-thirds of the monthly salary and the full amount of the doctoral scholarship is not less than the minimum monthly wage multiplied by a coefficient of 1.2 and then rounded up to the nearest ten crowns.
- (5) The decisive amount of the minimum wage for the calculation of the doctoral scholarship according to paragraph 4 is set by Section 91a(4), last sentence, of the Act.
- (6) If the doctoral student's income within the meaning of Section 91a(1) of the Act reaches at least the minimum monthly wage multiplied by a coefficient of 1.2 and then rounded up to the nearest ten crowns, the guaranteed doctoral scholarship does not have to be awarded, and any guaranteed doctoral scholarship already awarded may be reduced or withdrawn.
- (7) Proceedings concerning a guaranteed doctoral scholarship shall be initiated upon delivery of the student's application to the dean; the application shall include a statutory declaration of all previous and concurrent doctoral studies; this shall not apply to applications submitted after at least four months from the date of enrolment in the programme. The procedure may also be initiated ex officio in the case of a reduction, increase or withdrawal of a doctoral scholarship.
- (8) The amount of the basic doctoral scholarship and the details of its award to students of doctoral degree programmes shall be determined by the dean. The dean may further determine the conditions and rules for awarding a higher amount of

the guaranteed doctoral scholarship differently than specified in paragraphs 4 and 6.

- (9) The basic doctoral scholarship is awarded by the dean ex officio.
- (10) The doctoral scholarship under this article is awarded separately for each academic year or part thereof during which the student is deemed to meet the conditions for its award, including for the holiday period. The doctoral scholarship may also be awarded retroactively.
- (11) If, during the review of doctoral studies, the programme board finds that a student who has been awarded a guaranteed doctoral scholarship or a basic doctoral scholarship is seriously failing to fulfil the study obligations arising from his or her individual study plan, it shall propose to the dean that the scholarship be reduced or withdrawn. In its proposal, it shall specify which study obligations the student has failed to fulfil.
- (12) The dean shall decide on the proposal of the programme board pursuant to paragraph 11 without undue delay; before doing so, he or she may give the student a reasonable opportunity to comment on the proposal of the programme board. The dean is not bound by the amount of the reduction proposed by the programme board, even if the programme board proposes a full reduction, i.e. the withdrawal of the doctoral scholarship.
- (13) In accordance with Section 68(3) of the Act, the first step in the procedure for reducing or withdrawing a scholarship under this Article is the issuance of a decision.
- (14) The dean may lay down additional conditions or a different procedure for the reduction or withdrawal of the basic doctoral scholarship, as well as for its increase or re-award, by means of an ordinance.
- (15) A student who has been awarded a guaranteed doctoral scholarship is obliged to report to the dean any circumstances that could result in the scholarship being reduced or withdrawn, in particular the commencement of new employment, a change in job description or an increase in salary or wages relating to the employment known to the dean at the time of the decision granting the doctoral scholarship.
- (16) A student is entitled to request an increase in the guaranteed doctoral scholarship if circumstances arise that justify such an increase. The provisions of paragraphs 7 and 10 apply analogously to decisions on scholarship increases.

Article 14

Payment of scholarships

- (1) Students are entitled to the payment of the scholarship awarded to them, and the amount of the scholarship awarded may not be reduced during the period of validity

of the decision, unless the reasons for which the scholarship was awarded have changed, unless otherwise specified in these scholarship regulations. If the scholarship was awarded on the basis of the student's application, the student is obliged to notify the dean of any change in the information on which the application for the scholarship was based within eight days at the latest.

- (2) The scholarship is paid by bank transfer to a bank account held in Czech korunas, the number of which is specified by the student for this purpose in their personal records in IS STAG. Scholarships for study and scientific research activities abroad may also be paid in euros to the bank account specified in the relevant agreement concluded with the scholarship recipient.
- (3) Each student is required to ensure that the correct, complete and current number of their bank account is stated in their personal records in IS STAG. If the student fails to fulfil this obligation even after a request made by the faculty's student affairs office within the set deadline, the payment of the scholarship will be suspended until this obligation is fulfilled. In justified cases, the scholarship may be paid in cash at the faculty cash desk at the student's request.
- (4) The date of payment of the scholarship or its individual instalments and the notification of the obligation under paragraph 3 are an integral part of the decision to award the scholarship or the relevant agreement concluded with the scholarship recipient.
- (5) The payment of a scholarship that was not awarded as a one-off scholarship, or the payment of a scholarship awarded in accordance with Article 6, Article 7(1) and (3), Article 9, Article 10 and Article 12, shall be suspended if the person to whom the scholarship was awarded has lost their student status under the law.
- (6) If, after interrupting their studies, a student re-enrols in the period for which the scholarship was awarded before the interruption, they shall be entitled to the restoration of the payments of the previously awarded scholarship.
- (7) A scholarship that has been paid out unjustifiably, in particular on the basis of incorrect information or due to non-compliance with the condition specified in paragraph 1, must be returned by the student. The deadline, method and procedure for returning the scholarship shall be determined by an official decision of the authority that awarded the scholarship.

Article 15

Transitional provisions

- (1) Proceedings commenced before the entry into effect of these scholarship rules shall be completed in accordance with the existing scholarship rules.
- (2) Ordinances issued by the dean setting the amount of the basic doctoral scholarship and the details of its award issued before the effect of these scholarship rules shall

be considered ordinances under Article 13(8) of these rules. Unless they expressly state that they apply to the status of students defined in Article 13(3) of these regulations, they shall be deemed not to apply to them.

Article 16

Final provisions

- (1) The USB Scholarship Regulations registered by the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports on 16 May 2017 under No. MSMT-11444/2017 are hereby repealed.
- (2) These Scholarship Regulations were approved by the USB Academic Senate on 29 April 2025 pursuant to Section 9(1)(b)(3) of the Act.
- (3) These Scholarship Regulations come into force pursuant to Section 36(4) of the Act on the date of their registration by the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports.
- (4) These scholarship regulations shall take effect on the tenth day after their publication in the public section of the USB website, with the exception of the provisions of Article 2(1)(j), which shall take effect on 1 September 2025.
