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1. Context of the proposal

Cultural heritage provides insights into a society's artistic views and architectural growth. It is understood that cultural heritage is not just a physical space but a multidimensional phenomenon that influences social identity, historical continuity, and a country's economy. Furthermore, cultural heritage can be seen as a source of income through both tangible and intangible cultural assets. Increasing local awareness and strengthening educational activities are crucial to prevent negative effects, such as the loss of cultural value in the digital age. Preserving cultural heritage requires integrating diverse academic perspectives, including natural and environmental sciences, history, anthropology, digital technologies, and economics. This interdisciplinary approach enhances cultural resilience and identity. A comprehensive framework that combines scientific knowledge, critical thinking, and research skills is essential. In managing tangible and intangible heritage assets, inclusive and adaptive strategies should align with sustainable development goals. These insights help us better understand how to safeguard cultural heritage while supporting social, economic, and environmental sustainability ideas/products/start-ups.

In this respect, the KreativEU Seed Funding Initiative is designed for students, staff, researchers, and stakeholders to generate new knowledge across countries and disciplines collaboratively. This initiative offers a vital financial framework to support the development of innovative research-based, artistic endeavors, entrepreneurial ventures, technological advancements, and societal projects. Additionally, it facilitates internal competitions to identify and promote the best ideas, products, and start-ups.

This proposal is fully consistent with the *D6.2 KreativEU Seed Funding Initiative – Regulation, Version 1.0 | June 2025*.

1.1. Aims

KreativEU Seed funding – Medium-scale Project Call „Critical Eco-Cultural Heritage Interdisciplinary Approaches” aims to finance the best idea/product/start-up that focuses on entrepreneurship and innovation by applying analytical tools to real heritage objects and strengthening critical thinking and research skills. The critical eco-cultural vision of the proposal must align with the assumed objectives of the KreativEU project and ensure that its initiatives not only embrace cultural and ecological interconnectedness but also leverage digital advancements to enhance the accessibility, dissemination, and understanding of cultural heritage.

1.2. Priorities

- Methods for analyzing tangible and intangible heritage assets;
- Understanding historical, cultural, and symbolic value;
- Applying analytical tools to real heritage objects;
- Strengthening critical thinking and research skills.

2. Type and duration of projects to be funded

KreativEU Seed Funding – Medium-scale Project Call „Critical Eco-Cultural Heritage Interdisciplinary Approaches” is designated for the participation of students, academic and non-academic staff, researchers, artists, entrepreneurs, administrative staff, experts, and stakeholders from all career stages; no financial support can be granted to third parties.

For the Medium-scale Project Call – Theme „Critical Eco-Cultural Heritage Interdisciplinary Approaches”, the team must include students and staff from at least two different KreativEU Partner Institutions, but involving students and staff from more Partner Institutions is highly encouraged. Each project is also encouraged to involve at least one associated partner (though this is not mandatory). However, associated partners cannot benefit from any contribution from the KreativEU Seed Funding overall budget allocation according to Article 9 of the Grant Agreement 101177256. Individual projects will not be considered for funding.

The Coordinator of each project (referred to as “Lead Applicant” during the application process) must be a staff member of one of the KreativEU Partner Institutions.

Medium-scale projects can last up to 24 months; the maximum funding grant for seed projects is € 30,000.00.

3. Budget allocation and eligible /ineligible costs

The maximum amount of funding that can be granted to the KreativEU project from its budget is €30,000. Eligible/ineligible costs are fully presented in the next subsections in accordance with D6.2 KreativEU Seed Funding Initiative – Regulation, Version 1.0 | June 2025.

3.1. Eligible costs

- travel and subsistence costs for project meetings, collaborative work, research-based visits, or participation in workshops;
- events organization (goods & services);
- consumables and equipment directly related to the project activities;
- costs related to dissemination of project results (e.g., presentation materials);
- other goods and services.

3.2. Ineligible costs

- activities outside the scope of the approved project or the eligible period;
- costs already funded by other sources (double funding);
- general institutional overheads or administrative costs not directly linked to project activities (unless a specific provision exists);
- VAT, unless non-recoverable under national legislation;
- excessive or reckless expenditure;
- direct financial support to Associated Partners and to third parties outside the KreativEU Partner institutions.

3.3. Financial rules

- the medium-scale projects call is opened for all KreativEU partners;
- just projects which obtained a minimum 70 points are eligible for financing;
- the lead applicant institution will decide the financing of eligible projects as well as the number of financed projects (according to the score obtained in evaluation process).

4. Eligibility criteria

The following general eligibility criteria must be considered according to D6.2 KreativEU Seed Funding Initiative – Regulation, Version 1.0 | June 2025.

- the Lead Applicant (or the Project Coordinator) must be a staff member of one of the KreativEU Partner Institutions;
- each project team must be comprised of members (staff, researchers, students) from at least two distinct KreativEU Partner Institutions; recommendation: students must be at least 50% from the project team;
- the funding application complies with the technical specifications for drafting and formatting;
- to avoid double funding, it is prohibited to submit projects that aim to carry out activities already funded or currently being funded by other projects;
- projects must directly contribute to the objectives of KreativEU (Annex 4);
- activities must comply with the local and national policies of the Participating Institutions;
- the requested budget and duration are in line with the conditions set out in this guideline.

5. Submission of applications

Applications for medium-scale projects must be submitted electronically via Moodle Platform (<https://moodle.kreativeu.org/>), section KreativEU Seed Funding (<https://seed.valahia.eu/>), created for this purpose. The applications must follow the specifications outlined in the present Guideline Call Theme: „Critical Eco-Cultural Heritage Interdisciplinary Approaches”, for Medium-scale Project, under KreativEU Seed Funding Initiative, and use the official templates provided by D6.2 KreativEU Seed Funding Initiative – Regulation, Version 1.0 | June 2025 (Annex 1). For assistance (i.e., information and questions regarding the different calls), applicants may contact the project responsible.

A Lead Applicant and a Host Institution responsible for project coordination and financial administration must be designated.

Applications must include (for detailed information, see Annex 1):

- project title and acronym (if any);
- list of participating team members and their Partner Institutions;
- designated Lead Applicant and Host Institution;

- project abstract, objectives, and activities;
- clear justification of alignment with the aims and priorities set out in this document;
- work plan and timeline;
- detailed budget breakdown justifying the requested funds under eligible categories;
- expected results, impact, and dissemination plan;
- statement of compliance with ethical rules and institutional policies.

6. Selection and evaluation criteria

An evaluation panel will be formed to evaluate the project applications. To ensure a transparent and fair selection, for this call, each participating KreativEU Partner Institution will provide the names of 2 potential evaluators. These may be comprised of experts from within KreativEU, but also invited persons with relevant expertise.

General and specific evaluation and selection criteria to be used by the evaluation panel will be considered according to D6.2 KreativEU Seed Funding Initiative – Regulation, Version 1.0 | June 2025. General criteria will include:

- impact of the proposal on the KreativEU project (compliance with KreativEU objectives – Annex 4);
- competitiveness, entrepreneurship, and innovation on eco-cultural heritage;
- proposed activities must be feasible within the requested budget and timeframe;
- clear potential for long-term sustainability and/or plans for continuation after the funding period;
- interdisciplinarity of the proposal as well as the synergy between partners, etc.

Projects will be evaluated and grants allocated in a two-stage process. After the call has been released and applicants have sent in their proposals, the panel will evaluate the proposals and produce a list of projects to be considered for funding, grading them according to the general criteria defined above and other criteria that may be set out in that specific call (Annex 6).

Conflicts of interest must be avoided by evaluation panel members. The overall implementation of the funded projects will be assessed in the final report stage, and if the proposed results were achieved.

7. Evaluation panel

Project proposals declared eligible are evaluated by experts from the KreativEU consortium, internationally recognized, PhDs, with at least 10 years of experience in scientific research. Each evaluator signs the Declaration of Impartiality, Confidentiality, and Competence (Annex 4).

8. Dissemination and acknowledgement obligations

The following **visual identity elements** are mandatory for the proposals financed by the **KreativEU Seed Funding Initiative**:

Funding disbursement is the final stage of the financial process, where ineligible costs or unspent amounts are transferred to the host institution via bank transfers.

SO5. SO6.
