

## Rules for entry and return to the Czech Republic for foreigners

Updated and complete information are available on the website of the Czech Ministry of Interior here: <https://www.mvcr.cz/mvcren/article/coronavirus-information-of-moi.aspx>

The information may regularly change and it is necessary to check the current situation right before travelling to the Czech Republic.

The following rules apply for all foreigners with an exception of EU citizens with a certificate of temporary residence and foreigners with a permanent residence permit. These rules apply **from 5<sup>th</sup> April 2021**.

- ➔ You can enter to the Czech Republic only for essential reasons, including **study purposes**. It is recommended to have a proof of studies with you (student card, confirmation of studies).
- ➔ During the **first 14 days** after the arrival there is an **obligation to wear everywhere, even outside, a respirator type FFP2** (without exhalation valve that is certified at least FFP2, KN95, N95, AS/NZ P2, DS FFR, Korea 1st class FFR).

### 1. Arrival from a dark red country (not on the list of low-risk countries)

- You have the obligation to fill in the **electronic Public Health Passenger Locator Form** available at [www.prijezdovyformular.cz](http://www.prijezdovyformular.cz), which is an arrival announcement to the local regional public health authority. After filling in the form, you will receive a confirmation email that you should keep with you for further border control.
- You can enter the Czech territory **only with a negative result of RT-PCR test** for the presence of SARS CoV-2, which has been undergone not longer than **72 hours before the departure**.
- You must be in **self-isolation for at least 5 days**.
- **Arrange a new PCR test on the 6<sup>th</sup> day after arrival**.
- You can **end self-isolation when you submit negative result of the PCR test undergone in the Czech Republic**.

- As a foreigner studying in the Czech Republic, **you have to submit a negative PCR test result** to the university before entering university premises. Please, send this test result to your Faculty coordinator / Study department.

## 2. Arrival from a red country

- You have the obligation to fill in the **electronic Public Health Passenger Locator Form** available at [www.prijezdovyformular.cz](http://www.prijezdovyformular.cz) , which is an arrival announcement to the local regional public health authority. After filling in the form, you will receive a confirmation email that you should keep with you for further border control.
- You can enter the Czech territory **only with a negative result of antigen test** which has been undergone **max 24 hours before departure or RT-PCR test**, which has been undergone not longer than **72 hours before the departure**.
- In case you are **accommodated at USB Dormitory, you must have a PCR test on the arrival day! (antigen test IS NOT ACCEPTED)**
- You must be in **self-isolation** until you submit the negative result of a new PCR test.
- **Arrange a new PCR test** within the **first 5 days after arrival**.
- You can **end self-isolation when you submit negative result of the PCR test undergone in the Czech Republic** after your arrival.
- You must submit the test result without delay to the locally competent Regional Health Authority: Tel.: +420 387 712 111 / e-mail: [khsccb@khsccb.cz](mailto:khsccb@khsccb.cz)
- As a foreigner studying in the Czech Republic, **you have to submit a negative PCR test result** to the university before entering university premises. Please, send this test result to your Faculty coordinator / Study department.

## 3. Arrival from an orange country

- You have the obligation to fill in the **electronic Public Health Passenger Locator Form** available at [www.prijezdovyformular.cz](http://www.prijezdovyformular.cz) , which is an arrival announcement to the local regional public health authority. After filling in the form, you will receive a confirmation email that you should keep with you for further border control.
- You can enter the Czech territory **only with a negative result of antigen test** which has been undergone **max 24 hours before departure or RT-PCR test**, which has been undergone not longer than **72 hours before the departure**.
- In case you are accommodated at USB Dormitory, **you must have a PCR test on the arrival day! (antigen test IS NOT ACCEPTED)**
- As a foreigner studying in the Czech Republic, **you have to submit a negative PCR test result** to the university before entering university premises. Please, send this test result to your Faculty coordinator / Study department.

## 4. Arrival from a green country (low-risk country)

- If you are a non-EU citizen, you need to have a long term visa or residence permit. Keep a proof of studies with you. Check your personal situation before travelling.
- It is not necessary to fill-in any form neither to submit a negative PCR test.
